A Message from your Sovereign Prince

Princes of Jerusalem,

Every Freemason receives at least one or two Masonic mailings every month. Many of these magazines and newsletters have, on a regular basis, articles about the history of Freemasonry and or celebrated Freemasons. It has been said that those who fail to study history are doomed to repeat its mistakes. To a large extent, this is true. However, in the majority of Masonic readings, the subject is success and not failure. In this light, the corollary, the success stories of history should teach us how we, as Freemasons, can enhance our search for more light.

Every single one of us has a story. The plot of that story is our life. In another part of my journalism career, I was often assigned to write obituaries. Most of those stories were about what many would call "ordinary people" whose names and lives would soon be forgotten and never recorded in history. A very senior advised me early on that these "ordinary people" deserved my best writing as comfort to family and friends. Another tradition among journalists is the assignment to write your own obituary. A couple of attitudes come forward in this task. All of mother's teaching says you must be humble. However, the other side of that coin is the temptation to boast about all the trophies, awards and victories of your life. The solution here is to let someone else edit the obituary when you're done. In the end, all that ink will likely wind up as someone's fish wrapper.

There is one more approach to a personal history. It doesn't even involve writing anything down on paper. When all is said and done and you are called by the Almighty to go on that journey from which there is no return, the number of trophies, awards you have accumulated may be written down as your personal history. However, it will not matter how big your house was, how fast your car could go, what kind of clothes you wore, what elected offices

you held or what kind of success you had in business. What probably won't be mentioned but is much more important is the positive effect you had on the life or another human being. As Freemasons, we are obligated to something beyond ourselves. Without a doubt, our personal history, which may not be included in the newspaper obituary, is to have a lasting positive effect on another life. One person can be the spark that lights the fire in another's life. And only God knows what you did to light that spark. Imagine for a second, who lit the Masonic fire in George Washington, Ben Franklin, Gerald Ford and Harry Truman. Now think about what these Masons did to inspire so many other people.
